Who We Are

Our goal as an organization is to spread awareness and fund research for prostate cancer, so that men can continue to be there for their families and friends for years to come.

We mainly raise funds through large-scale one-day vehicle based fundraising events, the Ride For Dad, through sponsorships and through ongoing public fundraising throughout the year.

Ride For Dad events take place in more than 26 major cities across Canada. Our events have been taking place in Canada since the year 2000 and began with a motorcycle event. Now our events include snowmobiles, ATVs and personal watercraft! Since our first ride, more than 250,000 men, women and children have been involved in our fight against prostate cancer!

To date we have raised more than 41 million dollars to support prostate cancer research and raise public awareness

Key highlights of 2022

1. Fundraising and Events

- Our signature event, the "Ride for Dad" motorcycle campaign, continued to be a resounding success across Canada. In 2023, we organized rides/events in 26 cities, attracting over six thousand riders and thousands of supporters.
- Through these events, we raised over **\$2.5 million dollars**, which will be directly used for prostate cancer research and awareness programs

2. Expansion of Awareness Programs

• In 2023, we expanded our awareness programs, through innovative Media Campaigns reaching **hundreds of communities across the country**. Our goal was to provide information on early detection, screening options, and the importance of men's health.



3. Research Funding and Initiatives

• We funded **14 major research projects** in 2023, focused on developing advanced treatment options and improving early detection methods. Our partnerships with top medical institutions and universities have allowed us to support cuttingedge research aimed at saving lives and enhancing the quality of care for prostate cancer patients.
